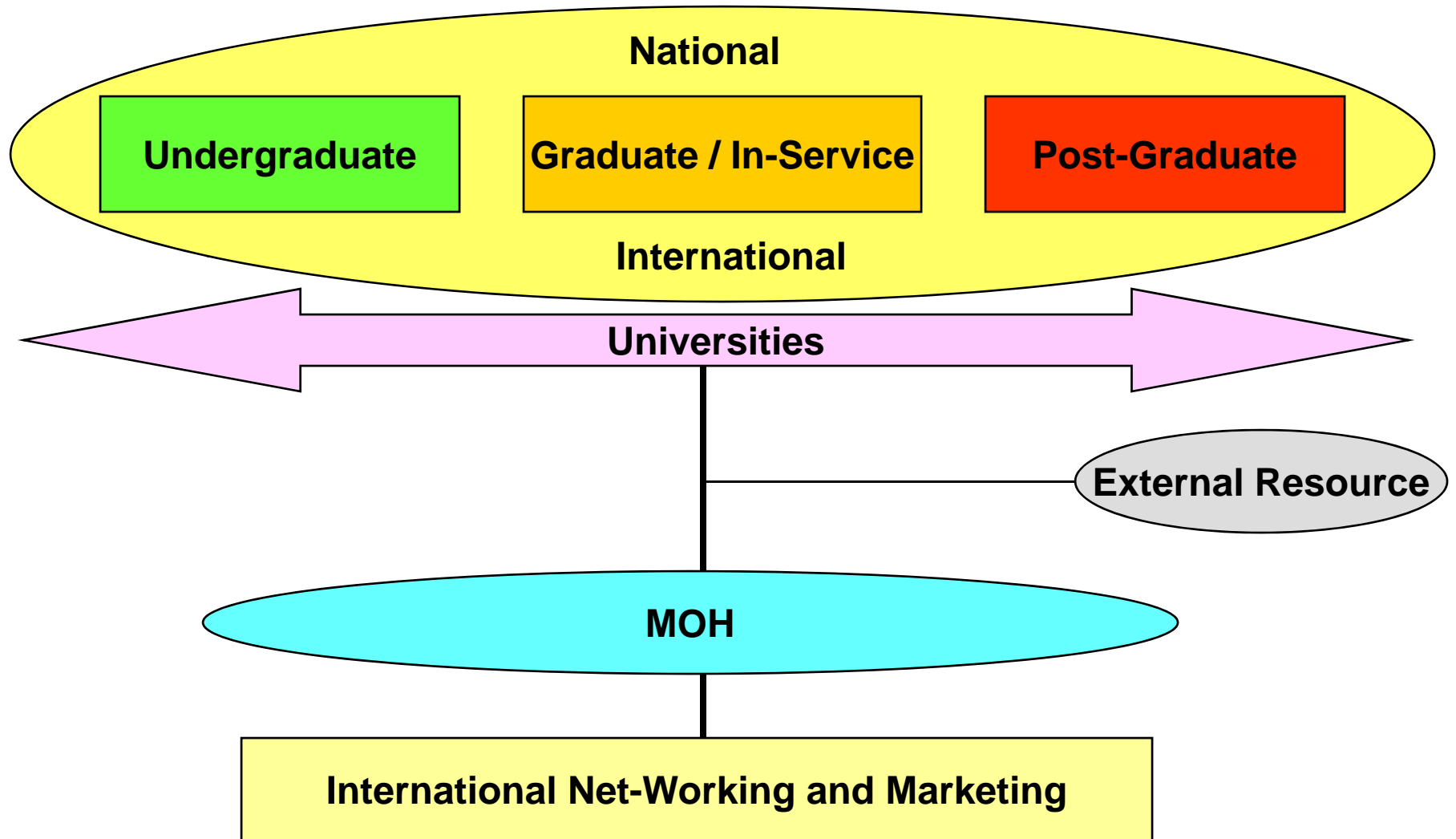

# Objective

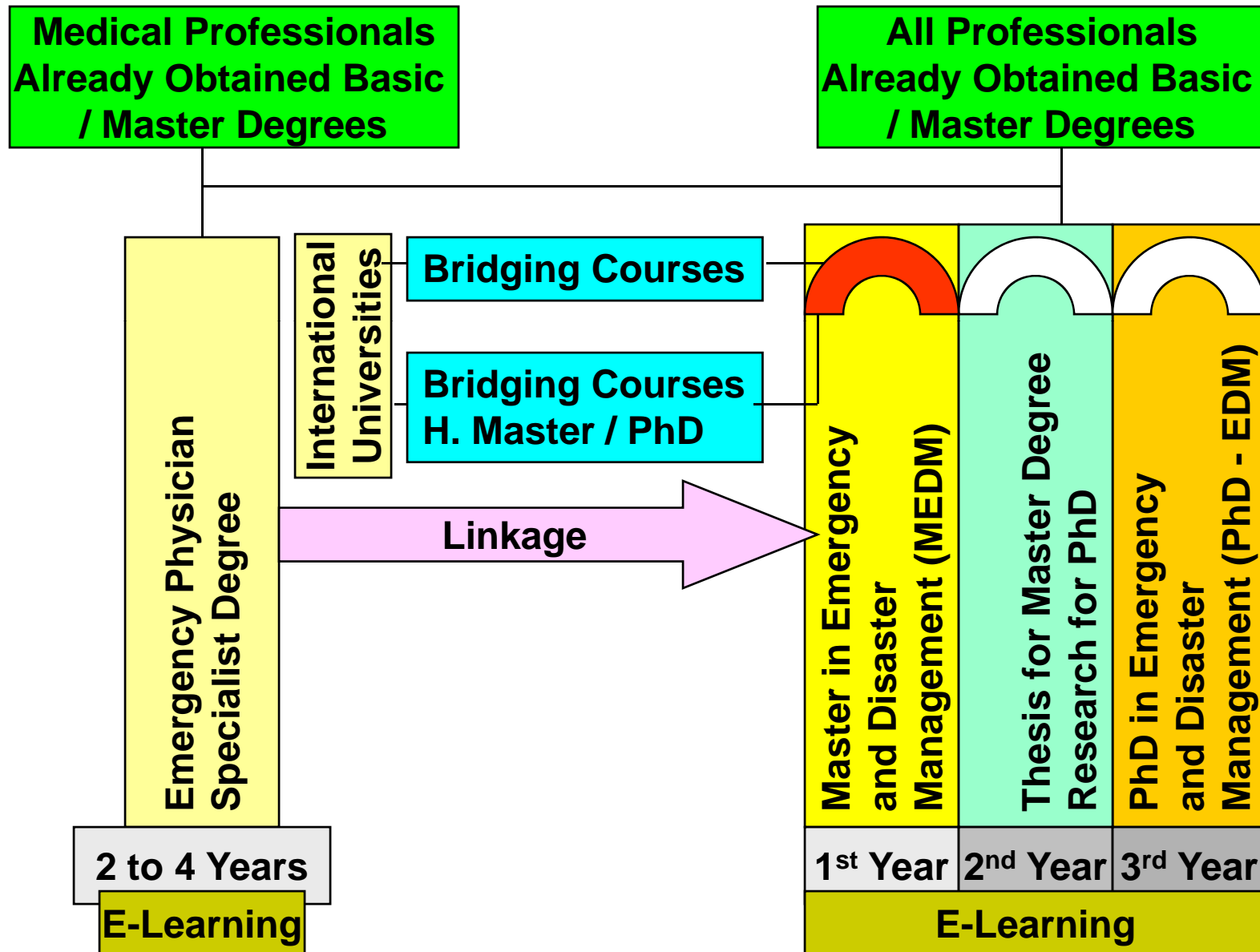

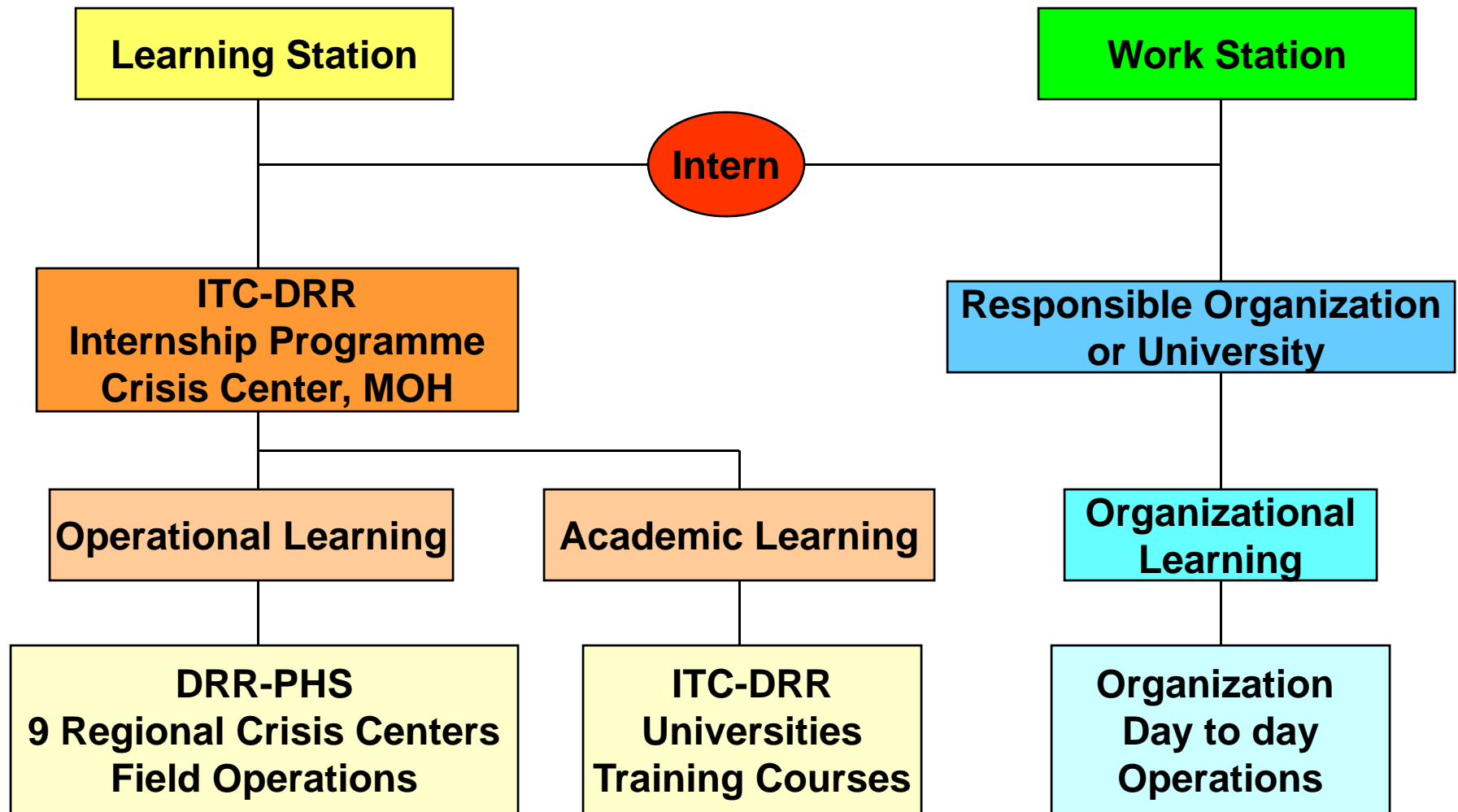

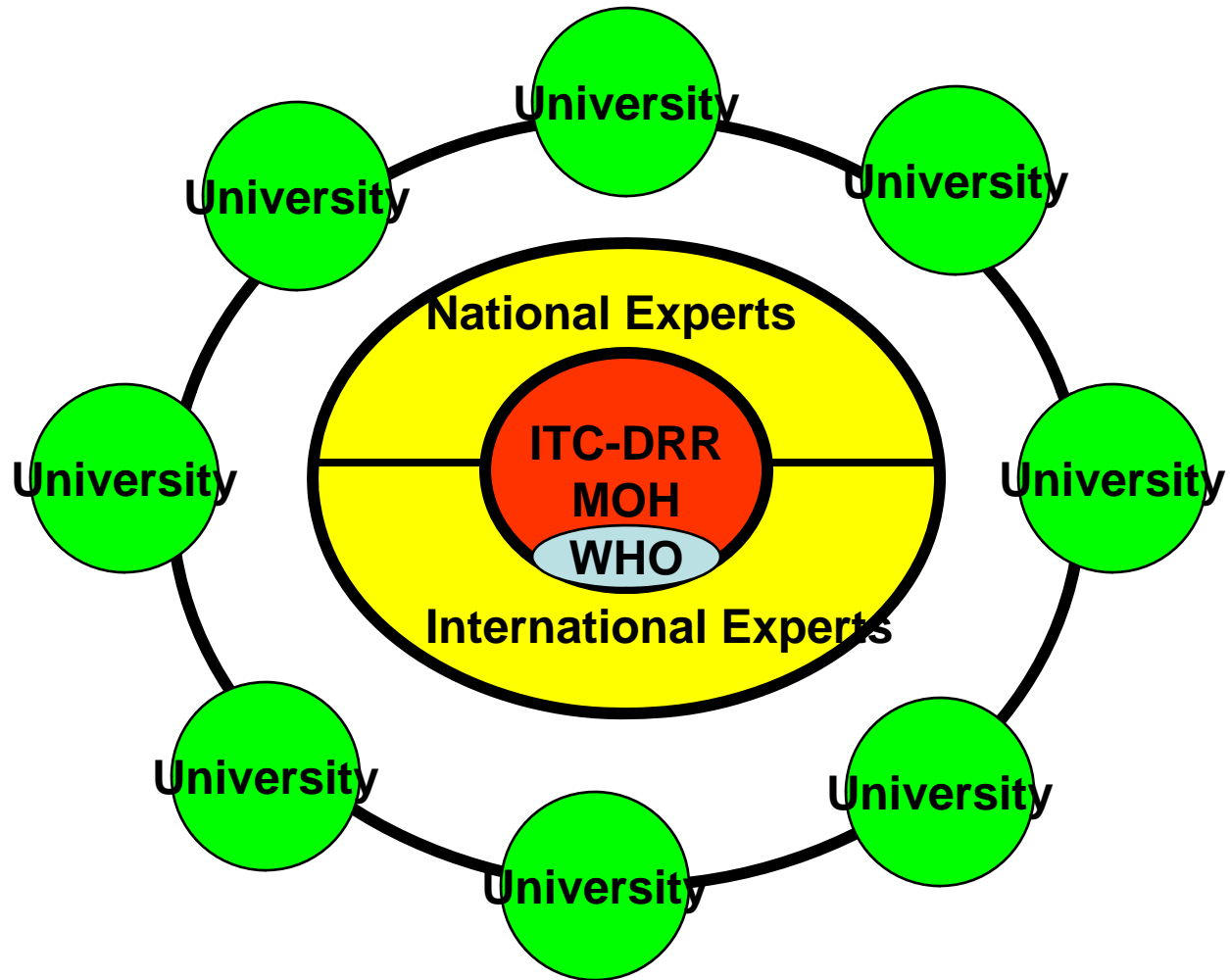
# ITC-DRR Master and PhD Programme Conceptual Frame Work



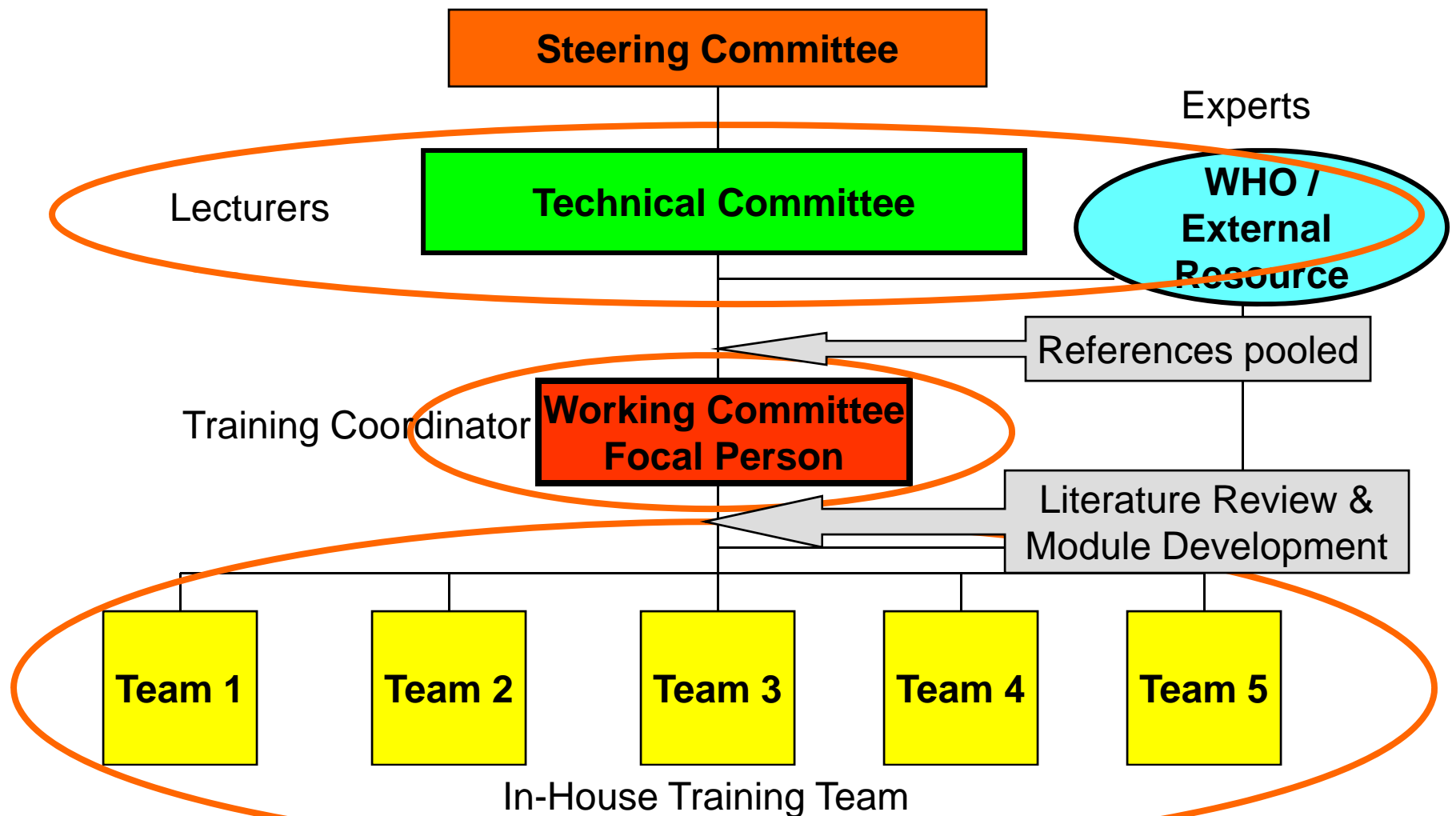
# ITC-DRR Internship Programme Conceptual Frame Work

**FLOOD, ACEH TIMUR**  
Monday, 23 November 2009 00:00

**HIGHLIGHTS**

- On Sunday, 22<sup>nd</sup> of November 2009, at about 2 am local time, flash floods triggered by heavy torrential rains occurred in Aceh Timur District.
- The floods inundated 12 villages in 4 Sub Districts, namely Alue ie Mirah, Alue ie Itam, Julok, and Keude Gerobak. Water level reached up to 2 meters high.
- 3,703 people became internally displaced.
- The flood has caused infrastructures and public facilities damaged.
- MOH already set up 3 health posts in Julok, 3 in Alur Mirah, 4 in Alur Itam and 1 in Keudeu Gerobak. The medicines are adequately available in order to anticipate post-flood disease.
- MOH, Crisis Center, Aceh Provincial Health Office and Aceh Timur District Health Office are in close collaboration with WHO Indonesia, provided integrated Emergency Health Services according to Standard Operating Procedures.

#### HIGHLIGHTS

- On Sunday, 22<sup>nd</sup> of November 2009, at about 2 am local time, flash floods triggered by heavy torrential rains occurred in Aceh Timur District.

### LANDSLIDE, PURWOREJO, CENTRAL JAVA

Monday, 23 November 2009 09:00

#### HIGHLIGHTS

Landslide in Purworejo, Central Java Province, Republic of Indonesia

- On Friday, 20<sup>th</sup> of November 2009 at 5 PM, a landslide incident occurred in Purworejo, Province of Central Java caused by high rainfall.
- Landslide affected 2 villages, Opedak and Giyombong. Transportation between the 2 villages is disrupted and caused Giyombong village still isolated.
- 50 houses are damaged.
- Landslide disrupted local transportation, electricity is still working.

MOH, Regional Crisis Center of Central Java, Central Java Provincial Health Office and Purworejo District Health Office in close collaboration with WHO Indonesia, provided Integrated Emergency Health Services according to standard Operating Procedures.
